Stalked Hollie by following her to London when she started training

Harassed Hollie while she was in the Bahamas

Embarrassed & humiliated Hollie on a family evening out

Bombarded Hollie with texts and calls

Hit Hollie or pushed her to the ground at the Notting Hill Carnival

He was caught on cctv with his hands around Hollie's throat

Stalking & Harassment

Persuasive & Controlling

Coercive Control

Turning up when she was out with friends

Quizzed one of her friends at her house

Threatened to beat Hollie up and throw acid in her face

Physically assaulted Hollie in January 2014. Threats against her family

Threatened to kill himself if she left him

Stole her car, threatened her to get in after beating three people up

Stalking and Coercive Controlling Behaviour

Constant monitoring of what she was doing and who with

Disrespectful to Hollie, her mum and our family

Playing mind games on her 20 birthday. The constant calls and texts

Turning up at the pub that she worked at to get away from him

Threatening to hurt her family if she did not do what he wanted

Isolation & humiliation

Degradation & Intimidation

Constant Surveillance

Mind Games & Entrapment

Controlling Behaviour







POLICE







Call Handler:

Initial call to Police reporting theft of card and money
Despite information being relayed to the call handler, info was not recorded and did
not make link to Domestic Abuse & Stalking
Obsessive and jealous behaviour characteristic of stalkers

Attending officers:

Vital information not passed on

Concentrated on the theft

Police handling was unsympathetic and threatening at a time when she was very vulnerable

DASH form not completed and Stalking questions not asked When taking statement following day put pressure on Hollie







On bail with:

3 accounts of common assault, possession of an offensive weapon, driving with excessive alcohol, taking without consent, driving without insurance

DHR - He was arrested 23 times in 6 years. He was involved in 24 violent incidents, 3 with Hollie, 14 with ex-partners, 3 involving his mum and 4 with unconnected persons

From 2008 – 2014 these incidents increased with intensity finally ending in homicide

Various agencies were aware of his history but did not put the pieces together. He is a serial perpetrator







Police intelligence held on Maslin indicated that he posed a number of risks including being high risk for:

Domestic abuse against his mother and previous partners. Suicidal, DAU high risk, drugs, violent

On the Domestic Violence database it stated that he was a: Previous perpetrator of DA with a number of ex partners Previous DASH completed and one was assessed as high risk of serious harm Referred to Glos DA Support Service – details not retained as against DPA

Hollie assessed as standard risk







Maslin Showed Typical Signs

Stalked her while in London turning up constantly where she was Vandalised and destroyed Hollie's property
Loitered near our home
Made threats of violence – throw acid in her face
Was violent towards Hollie on a couple of occasions
Constantly sending texts and calling up to 60 times a day
Had problems with drugs and alcohol
Had previous with the Police

HE IS A SERIAL PERPETRATOR







Maslin Showed Typical Signs

He knew her pattern of work - Working late on a Tuesday
He knew that the salon would be easily accessible
He knew that there would be few clients and people around

Hollie's rejection and his inability to cope Stalking was a way of communicating Homicide was his ultimate act of control







He eventually killed her at work, in front of her Colleagues

He was sentenced to life and 24 years, but he appealed

An Appeal was dismissed by Lord Chief Justice

Pupil Survey in Gloucestershire Secondary Schools Yrs 8 & Yrs 10

397 Pupils – Domestic Abuse was happening in their homes

272 Pupils – It was happening quite often or most days

127 Pupils – Abused sometimes by boyfriend or girlfriend

101 Pupils – Abused often or most days


10.5% of Pupils said that they needed more support with Domestic Abuse

Working Without Fear

Raising awareness of domestic abuse and stalking in the workplace

Create a strategy of prevention and handling those affected

Identify the responsibilities of the employer

Show the negative impact and risks to the business, victim and co-workers

How to raise awareness and spot the signs

How to provide an appropriate response and signpost disclosures

Carry out training workshops for management and employees

Provide policy templates, booklets, flyers and posters to raise awareness and educate

Provide ongoing support and advice



Working Without Fear - The Impact

Domestic Abuse

- 20% of employed women take time off work because of domestic abuse
- 56% of abused women arrive late for work at least 5 times a month
- 28% of abused women leave early at least 5 days a month
- 53% of women miss at least 3 days of work a month

Stalking

- 50% of stalking victims have curtailed or stopped work due to stalking
- 79% of male stalkers will use work resources to target the victim
- 75% of domestic violence stalkers will turn up at the workplace







CIPD Survey 2016

Employers cannot afford to ignore mental health in the workplace

Peoples work and domestic lives are entwined

Employers have a duty of care for the people they employ

Presenteeism is a real hidden issue that affects performance

Need to foster environments where staff feel comfortable

Employers are ill equipped to deal with this issue

Line manager training is vital

Need to spot the signs, intervene early and signpost







Examples of Good Employer Engagement

Having information available to assist Team Leaders to help staff

Referring staff to a specialist domestic abuse support service

Escorting an individual to and from home by one of the company's security team

Agreeing working flexi-hours so that a victim was not leaving and returning home at

the same time every day

Offer a victim a trial placement at another site 50 miles away

Drafting safety plans

Providing a family and friends support policy



In danger? A simple shake or tap activates Hollie Guard Your location, along with audio/video evidence, is automatically sent to our monitoring center. A second shake sends out a high pitched alarm and the flash starts to strobe, in order to attract maximum attention.
