Progress since September 2018

- Further strengthening the Facebook Page https://www.facebook.com/iwfiz/ by amalgamating council services enabling better ways of communicating with parents and young people.
- Better communication of the Local Offer through
 - Adding the icon onto emails
 - Sending out Local Offer leaflets when communicating with parents/carers
 - Adding Local Offer link to all SEN correspondence with parents /carers
- Updated and added a strategy section so all of our strategies are in <u>one place</u>. These include Accessibility Strategy, Transport, SEN and Post 14 etc.
- Introduced a termly SEN Newsletter for schools and parents/carers
- Carried out a SEND Strategic review across the island, the result of which will be published in September 2019.
- Introduced Prepaid cards to help parents/carers manage their personal budgets and /or additional services

Ongoing developments

- Adding a Dyslexia coloured background function to enable users to change the background colour to suit their needs.
- Adding "My Story" and "Our Story" as on line forms
- Resolving the "back button" issues within the Local Offer.
- Looking at a "Browsaloud" or equivalent function for the Local Offer
- Amalgamation of the WightChyps and Local Offer site to allow one platform for viewing information. This would include moving the Childcare Directory onto the front page of the Local Offer.
- Communication of the Local Offer: Refreshed update for the leaflets
- Agreement to review the Local Offer with Parents/Carers, Young People and lead practitioners under the headings of:
 - Things to change
 - Things to keep
 - Things to add
 - General feel of the website
 - Additional comments
- Work with another Local Authority to carry out a peer review of the Local Offer.
- Review the post 16 letters that are sent out to parents/young people
- Working with KIDS and our Parent/Carer forum set up a young person's SEND Youth Voice Forum.
- Set up an electronic process to support the creation of Education Health and Care Plans

Hi there

As you may be aware, I currently represent the Island at Hampshire district co-ordinator meetings for service pupils and their families as well as on The Solent Armed Forces Covenant Board.

This involves providing guidance to schools on potential barriers to learning; how to support the specific social, emotional and academic needs of service pupils through use of the Service Pupil Premium; and signposting the regional and national support available.

Whilst there are not significant numbers of service pupils in Island schools (approx 80) the Island does have the highest proportion of "vets" in the Solent area and many of these are of working age with young children. This group has been identified as "vulnerable" in terms of potential issues with adjusting to civilian life, re-employment, domestic violence, alcohol abuse and mental health issues.

I just wondered if it would be useful to provide a section within the Isle of Wight Local Offer on this aspect and would be happy to draft something if required. Guidance could also be provided to schools on a section that could be included in their SEND information reports if appropriate.
