- Predatory Stalker

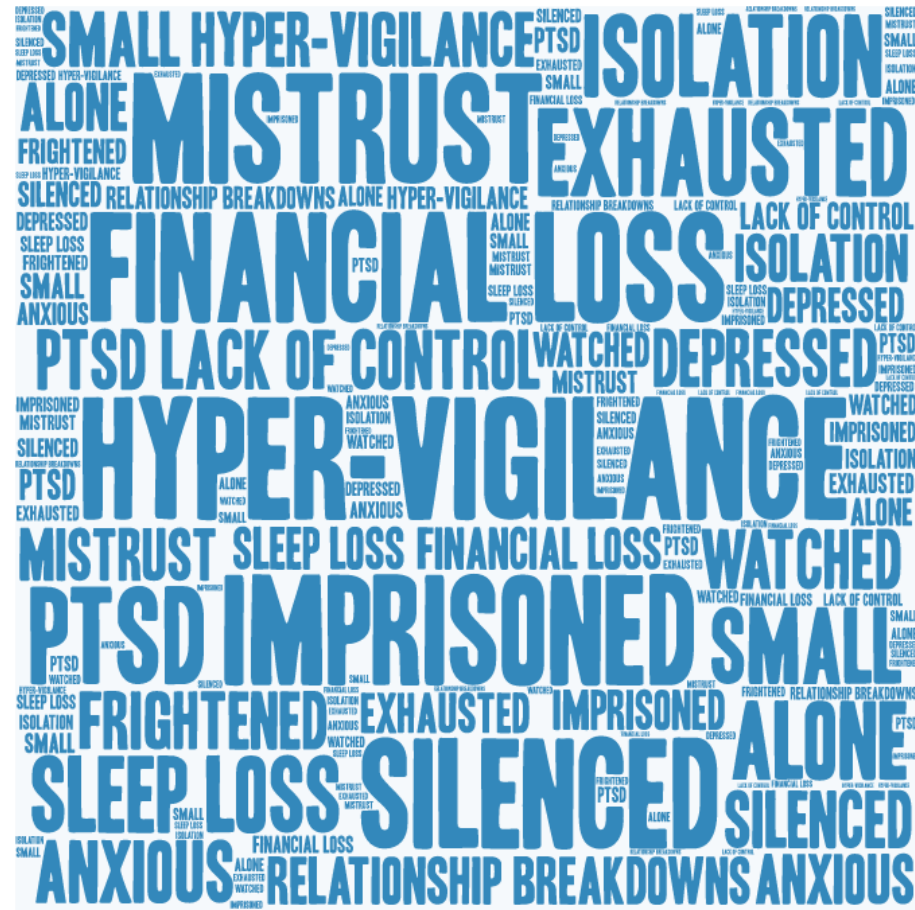
Stalking Behaviours

Identifying Stalking



DASH RIC, SDASH & SASH

1. Are you very frightened?
2. Is there previous harassment history?
3. Has there been destruction or vandalism of property?
4. Do they turn up three plus times a week?
5. Have they been following/loitering?
6. Have there been threats of physical or sexual violence?
7. Have any third parties been harassed?
8. Have they acted out violently to others?
9. Have they persuaded others to assist?
10. Are they known to be misusing substances?
11. Is there prior violence (physical/psychological)?
12. Is the suspect known to have mental health conditions or engagement with mental health services?
