A communal establishment is defined as an establishment providing managed residential accommodation. Managed means full-time or part-time supervision of the accommodation.

Communal establishments


There are a wide variety of communal establishments on the island, but the most common category is 'hotel or boarding/guest houses', followed closely by 'private residential care homes'.


Note: Small hotels and guesthouses are treated as communal establishments if they have the capacity for ten or more guests, excluding the owner/manager and his/her family.



Persons present in communal establishments



The distribution of people in communal establishments shows a much wider spread, reflecting the existence of large establishments of this kind in many other parts of the Island. Once again, Parkhurst ward stands out because of the substantial number of people 'resident' in the three prisons and the hospital.
