On the west bank of the *Medina* looking towards *Newport*, this shows the *Pilot Inn*. By 1834 this was replaced by the *Ship and Launch* and in 1935 its licence was removed to the *Folly Inn* at *Whippingham*.

The *Eel Pie Inn* is still in existence and is today called the *Folly Inn*. It is situated on the east bank of the *River Medina* near *Whippingham* between *Cowes* and *Newport*.
