East Cowes is at the head of the estuary providing the holiday and yachting resort of Cowes with a welcoming and popular sand and shingle beach. As well as visitors from the mainland it is also a favourite location for local residents of East Cowes. A variety of traditional seafront facilities are available, with a promenade, woodland walks and a well equipped children's play area and paddling pool. Toilet and shower facilities are available mid-way along the award beach. Public transport is minimal but there is ample parking for those using their own vehicle.

East Cowes seafront is only minutes from the town's shops, cafes, pubs and restaurants.

East Cowes is one of the Island's award winning beaches.

Like anywhere, East Cowes has its natural hazards so be sure to read the safety guidelines and have a good time. Information is provided at each area so check this out to ensure your own safety.

Pre-Arrival

The location of the beach can be found on the Council's web site by visiting www.iwight.com/just_visiting. The nearest bus station is located in Well Street which is approximately a ten minute walk from the beach. Planning your journey using

public transport can be made easy by using www.iwight.com/just_visiting and having the appropriate post codes ready.

Car Parking and Arrival

Parking is limited at East Cowes with no parking on the Esplanade and a small unmarked tarmaced area for free parking.

Areas Adjacent to the Beach

A public footpath runs alongside the beach, which adjoins the public highway. Speed restrictions of 20mph are in place with speed bumps to enforce this.

Beach Access Points

Access is made via concrete slipways or steps which are located at regular intervals along the Esplanade.

On the Beach

The beach is made up of shingle and is subject to seaweed influx at all times of the year which may make access difficult at times.

Public Toilets

Toilet facilities are available towards the far end of the award beach. The floor area consists of 13 square metres and is utilised with four cubicles together with one urinal and on disabled unit.

Cleansing facilities are available by way of six wall gate units.

Food & Drink Outlets

East Cowes is a very quiet location and mainly popular to locals or passengers waiting to return to the mainland on the Red Funnel car ferry.

Mid-way along the Esplanade is a food and drink outlet that provides hot and cold snacks together with ice creams and beach goods.

Additional information

Dogs are not permitted between 1 May and 30 September on the beach between the beach from slipway opposite the public conveniences on East Cowes Esplanade, up to the first set of steps past the public conveniences out to the mean low water mark.
