- The attention of candidates and electors is drawn to the rules for filling up nomination papers and other provisions relating to nomination contained in the parliamentary elections rules in Schedule 1 to the Representation of the People Act 1983.
- 2. Where a candidate is commonly known by some title he may be described by his title as if it were his surname.
- 2A. Where a candidate commonly uses a name or names-
 - (a) that are different from the candidate's full names as stated on the nomination paper, or
 - (b) in a different way from the candidate's full names as stated on the nomination paper,

the commonly used name or names may also appear on the nomination paper; but if they do so, the commonly used name or names (instead of any other name) will appear on the ballot paper.

- 2B. But the ballot paper will show the other name if the Returning Officer thinks -
 - (a) that the use of the commonly used name may be likely to mislead or confuse electors, or
 - (b) that the commonly used name is obscene or offensive.
- 3. An elector may not subscribe more than one nomination paper for the same election.
- 4. A person whose name is entered in the register may not subscribe a nomination paper if the entry gives as the date on which he will become of voting age is a date later than the day fixed for the poll.
- 5. A candidate supported by a certificate of authorisation signed by the Nominating Officer of a political party (or someone on their behalf) may use the party name or a description allowed by that certificate and registered with the Electoral Commission. A candidate may stand on behalf of two or more different parties and use a registered joint description if supported by certificate(s) of authorisation from each of the parties. Any candidate may alternatively use the description of 'Independent' (and/or 'Annibynnol' in Wales), or leave the description box blank.

DECLARATION OF SECRECY **ELECTION OF COUNCILLORS**

To persons attending at the opening of the postal ballot box, the taking of the poll or the counting of votes at this election.

Your attention is drawn to the provisions of Section 66, sub-section (1), (2), (3) and (6) of the Representation of the People Act 1983, which are set out below.

These provisions concern the maintaining of secrecy of the voting and should be read carefully before you attend at any polling station or at the counting of the votes.

REPRESENTATION OF THE PEOPLE ACT, 1983 Section 66, sub-sections (1), (2), (3) and (6)

- 1. The following persons:
 - every Returning Officer and every Presiding Officer or clerk attending at a (a) polling station;
 - (b) every candidate or election agent or polling agent so attending; shall maintain and aid in maintaining the secrecy of voting and shall not, except for some purpose authorised by law, communicate to any person before the poll is closed any information as to
 - the name of any elector or proxy for an elector who has or has not (i) applied for a ballot paper or voted at a polling station;
 - the number on the register of electors of any elector who, or whose (ii) proxy, has or has not applied for a ballot paper or voted at a polling station; or
 - the official mark. (iii)
- 2. Every person attending at the counting of the votes shall maintain and aid in maintaining the secrecy of voting and shall not
 - ascertain or attempt to ascertain at the counting of the votes the number on (a) the back of any ballot paper;
 - (b) communicate any information obtained at the counting of the votes as to the candidate for whom any vote is given on any particular ballot paper.
- 3. No person shall
 - interfere with or attempt to interfere with a voter when recording his vote; (a)
 - (b) otherwise obtain or attempt to obtain in a polling station information as to the candidate for whom a voter in that station is about to vote or has voted;
 - (c) communicate at any time to any person any information obtained in a polling station as to the candidate for whom a voter in that station is about to vote or has voted, or as to the number on the back of the ballot paper given to a voter at that station;
 - (d) directly or indirectly induce a voter to display his ballot paper after he has marked it so as to make known to any person the name of the candidate for whom he has not has not voted.
- If any person acts in contravention of this section, he shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding level 5 on the standard scale or imprisonment for a term not exceeding six months.
