Isle of Wight Council Island Planning Strategy Regulation 18 Consultation Summary Statement

1 Introduction

- 1.1 This Consultation Statement has been prepared in accordance with Regulation 18 ('preparation of a local plan') of the Town and Country Planning (Local Planning) Regulations 2012. These regulations set out specific bodies and persons which must be consulted during the preparation of a local plan.
- 1.2 This Consultation Statement sets out:
 - (i) the bodies and persons invited to make representations under Regulation 18 (Appendix 1).
 - (ii) How those bodies and persons were invited to make such representations (Appendix 2).
 - (iii) A summary of the main issues raised by those representations; and
 - (iv) how the main issues raised are to be taken into account.

2 The Island Planning Strategy Regulation 18 Consultation Process

2.1 Public comments were invited over a 9 week consultation period which ran between Friday 30 July 2021 until 5pm Friday 1 October 2021. The documents which were the subject of this consultation are shown in the table below.

2.2 The consultation was undertaken in accordance with the council's Statement of Community Involvement (SCI) adopted in August 2015. The specific and general consultees from the SCI have been included on the council's local plan consultation database, alongside organisations or individuals who have expressed an interest in being consulted on or in being kept informed of planning policy development. In broad terms the consultees include: -

developers and agents
Parish and town councils
the general public
local organisations
previous consultation respondents
people who have registered themselves on the council's consultation database
via the consultation portal

- 2.3 The Local Plan consultation database is live and continually updated. There are currently **1909**¹ individuals on the contact database with an interest in the Local Plan process.
- 2.4 The SCI also sets out how the council will consult (see extract below)
 - `2.5 Planning law and its associated guidance sets out the requirements as to how and when consultation will be undertaken and also who should be consulted. Outside of any legal requirements we will choose consultation methods appropriate to the document in question, balancing cost and time constraints with the likely relevance of the plan to specific communities/organisations.
 - 2.6 The council's planning policy web site pages are the main source of information on all planning policy documents. All consultations on plans and applications for neighbourhood plans will be announced through these pages and by notice in the Isle of Wight County Press.
 - 2.7 In addition the council will choose from a range of techniques as appropriate, including:

Providing Information

Notices in local media and town and parish newsletters.

Email bulletins.

Leaflets.

Involvement in the preparation of draft plans

Meeting and workshops with existing groups.

Bespoke consultations on specific issues.

Seeking comments on draft documents

Consultation documents will be available in specific locations – the web page will list where and when.

Direct contact with relevant groups via email/letter.

Using on-line consultation software to allow you to submit your comments.

- 2.5 In Regulation 18 consultation, the consultation methods used were:
 - contacting the appropriate organisations and individuals electronically or by post
 - ii. promotion via the Council's web pages and social media accounts
 - iii. display of documents at locations open to the public such as the Council offices and the libraries across the island
 - iv. press releases, town and parish council events, pop up consultation events and a business expo event
- 2.6 The council must demonstrate that it has discharged the Duty to Co-operate with Neighbouring Authorities under Section 110 of the Localism Act 2011. The council has on-going dialogue with its neighbouring authorities and a separate report is being prepared on the discharge of the Duty to Co-Operate requirement.

How the consultation was undertaken

- 2.8 Those on the public consultation database were contacted by email or letter informing them of the consultation arrangements and where the documents could be viewed. A template of the letter sent is attached in **Appendix 3**.
- 2.9 A formal public notice was placed in the Isle of Wight County Press on the **30 July 2021**. A copy of the public notice is shown in **Appendix 4**.
- 2.10 The text placed on the council's website advertising the consultation is set out in **Appendix 5.**
- 2.11 Posts were added to the council's Facebook page and Twitter. Copies of these are shown in **Appendix 6.**

- 2,12 A copy of the consultation response form is set out in **Appendix 7.**
- 2.13 The consultation supporting documents were made available to view and download on the council's website (Appendix 8).
- 2.14 Paper copies of the Island Planning Strategy were also available for public viewing in all the libraries and at the reception areas at County Hall and Seaclose Office during office hours. Printed copies of the draft IPS could be printed off or purchased on request.
- 2.15 Comments on the Plan could be made through the online consultation portal and were also accepted by email and by letter.
- 2.16 A summary of the consultation process is shown in the table below.

- 2.17 In addition to the Island Planning Strategy consultation was undertaken on related work including:
 - A 'Call for Sites' was undertaken in June 2021. An email was sent to known agents, developers and landowners, a press release and information was provided on the council website.
 - Self-build Register the council launched a dedicated web page on 7 April 2016 so that people could register their interest. Registrations are being submitted on an on-going basis.
 - Brownfield sites register. A call for sites was undertaken between 15th February to Friday 19th March 2021 and 59 new sites came forward.

3 Summary of the Main Issues made

- 3.1 In total, 2,834 representations were received on the Island Planning Strategy from over 600 respondents. The comments made covered the whole Plan, but the majority were focussed on the overall housing number and the individual housing site allocations.
- 3.2 Comments were received from specific consultation bodies including for example, the Environment Agency, Hampshire County Council, Historic England, Natural England, Maritime Marine Organisation, Southern Water, Portsmouth City Council and Southampton City Council.
- 3.3 A summary of the issues raised by individuals and organisations is available in the separate Summary of Public Consultation responses document.
- 3.4 The overriding issues raised in the consultation responses concerned

- i. the level of housing growth proposed in the Plan and the desire to request exceptional circumstances from the government to reduce this number;
- ii. objections to the specific sites allocated for housing;
- iii. the lack of affordable housing for island residents;
- iv. the priority locations for growth;
- v. the number of second and short term holiday lets on the island; and
- vi. the widespread impacts on the island from meeting the proposed level of development.
- 3.5 Many respondents considered the housing need figures were exaggerated. The lack of infrastructure capacity was most frequently referred to as a factor justifying restraining housing development. Other responses on housing growth sought to either promote a particular location for housing development or to avoid development in an individual town or village.
- 3.6 Far fewer comments were received on the level and location of employment development proposed. Some considered that additional employment land was needed and should more closely reflect where housing growth is proposed. Others sought greater job creation, more skilled work opportunities and further employment provision in rural areas.
- 3.7 The other main issues raised across different policies in the Plan included:
 - A need for affordable housing to meet residents needs rather than for more retirees and for second home ownership
 - Developing empty and derelict buildings rather than using greenfield sites
 - Building on brownfield sites first
 - The impact of the proposed level of development on the tourism industry, a key employment sector and the destruction of the rural nature of the island which visitors come to see.

How the issues raised are to be addressed

3.9 A summary of the public consultation responses together with a brief council response is attached as a separate document (linked in paragraph 1.2). Following the IPS consultation further evidence was commissioned to inform the next stage of the Plan and to explore some of the issues raised (Regulation 19 Pre Submission). Conclusions

3.11 The comments submitted during the consultation have been considered along with the further evidence and updates to the policy context and have helped to inform the pre submission Regulation 19 version of the Plan. The Island Planning Strategy was agreed at Full Council 1st May 2024 to be published for a 6 week statutory consultation starting on Monday 8th July 2024 to allow representations to be made. In accordance with the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004 (PCPA), a planning inspector will consider all the comments made on the plan within the consultation period.

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


