
Ryde Sailing



The number of entries was not high. This was because the decision about which classes to race was taken less than one year before the games. All 3 classes, (6 metre keel boat, 7 metre keel boat and 8 metre keel boat) were won by the Great Britain crews.

Two women, Frances Rivett-Carnac in the 7 Metre, and the Duchess of Westminster as extra on her 8 Metre, participated in the games.
