VEHICLE PERMIT FOR DEPOSITING HOUSEHOLD WASTE AND RECYCLING AT A RECYCLING CENTRE

TERMS & CONDITIONS

The permit scheme allows access to the household waste recycling centres (HWRCs) at Lynnbottom and Afton Marsh for residents who use one or more of the vehicles identified in these terms and conditions to dispose of their own household waste

Householders have a duty of care to ensure that any waste created either by themselves or by paid tradespersons in their home is disposed of appropriately, safely and legally, either by themselves or by a licensed carrier of waste. To check that traders are licensed to carry waste, contact The Environment Agency.

Commercial waste is classed as **any** recycling and waste generated from a business activity, including home based and agricultural businesses. Commercial waste is not accepted at household waste recycling centers, therefore vans, commercial and sign written vehicles have restricted access to HWRCs to prevent trade waste being deposited illegally.

Commercial waste can be deposited at the Commercial Waste Recycling Centre at Lynnbottom (in the lower part) or at a private waste management site. To transport and deposit any waste arising from a business activity the individual/business must be registered as a waste carrier by law.

Vehicles needing permits

Householders who wish to use the following types of vehicle to dispose of **their own** household waste at a HWRC must have a permit:

- Any vehicle marked for commercial purposes (e.g. sign written);
- *Van (including a car derived vans, sprinter vans and campervans);
- Light goods vehicle;
- Pick-up truck or similar vehicle with a cargo area (e.g. Land Rover Defender)
- Flat Bed truck
- +Tipper vehicles (restrictions apply see below)
 - * Commercial vehicles which have been hired for four or less days will not require a
 permit, the rental agreement must be shown to the meet and greet staff
 - + Tipper vehicles are not permitted to use the household waste recycling centre at
 either Afton Marsh or Lynnbottom. However, tipper vehicles are permitted to dispose
 of their household waste in the Commercial Waste Recycling Centre at Lynnbottom.
 Tipper vehicles using this facility are recommended to visit between 4.30pm and
 6pm and must not use their tipper function at any time. Tipper vehicles are not
 permitted to use the CWRC at any time on Sundays.

Vehicles NOT Permitted to use the HWRC

- Tractors
- Agricultural vehicles and horseboxes
- Vehicles above 3.5 tonnes

Permit Terms:

- 1. Permits are tied to the vehicle not to the driver. Every time the vehicle uses the site will count as a visit.
- 2. Each permit enables 12 visits. Each card has 12 scratch off panels, one will be removed on each visit by the HWRC staff.
- 3. Permits are valid for Lynnbottom and Afton Marsh HWRCs only.
- 4. Vehicles that qualify for a permit will receive one permit card identifying the vehicle make, model, registration, colour and the permit date of issue.
- 5. Multiple visits in one day will each be counted as an individual visit.
- 6. Once 12 visits have been made, the site staff will retain the permit.
- 7. A new permit may be applied for after 12 visits have been made.
- 8. Amey will remove permits from persons using them to deposit commercial waste illegally.
- Persons suspected of depositing trade waste at the HWRC will be required to complete a
 declaration form confirming the waste they are carrying is their own household waste.
 These will be stored and crossed referenced if illegal use is suspected.

Permit application process:

- 1. Permits can be applied for online at www.iwight.com/waste or by contacting the Isle of Wight Council on (01983) 823777.
- 2. Following a successful application, Amey will post the permit to the address given on the application within [10] business days.

How to use the permit

On arrival at an HWRC, please hand your permit to a member of site staff who will confirm that your vehicle details match those shown and mark the permit to indicate that one visit has been used.

Only household wastes that are permitted at the HWRC may be deposited.

Residents are requested to segregate recyclables prior to arrival at the site to ensure all materials are correctly recycled.

If you change your vehicle

Destroy your existing permit, and then apply for a new permit with the new details. The permit is only valid for the vehicle that appears on the permit.
