Matter 7: Issue 2 – Delivering an appropriate mix of house tenures and types

- 1. Approach to delivering affordable housing Policies AFF1 and H5 and striking an appropriate balance between ensuring residential development as a whole remains viable whilst improving affordable housing delivery.
